Course code	Course Name	Course Outcome
PLSH-CC I	Understanding Political Theory	This course familiarizes students to the idea of politics and the political theory. The course provides an understanding of various theories and approaches to politics and its recent trends. It also acquainted with the operational aspects of politics, like, democracy, representation and participation.
PLSH-CC II	Constitutional Government and Democracy in India	The course provides the students' knowledge about the framing of constitution and the philosophy of the constitution. Students also able to comprehend the pattern and working of the constitutional posts. It also provides knowledge about rural and urban Self Governments.
PLSH GE-I	Nationalism in India	Through this course the students acquainted with the nature of nationalism in India and the struggle of the people against colonialism. The students also will gain knowledge about the different dimensions of freedom struggle: class, caste, gender and communal questions.
Semester-II		
PLSHCC-3	Political Theory- Concepts and Debates	The course aims to introduce the students to the key concept of political theory, like, liberty, equality, justice and rights. It also familiarizes students with the important debates related to the issues of political obligation, civil disobedience, cultural relativism and multiculturalism which in turn help to enhance their analytical skills about understanding of concept.
PLSHCC-4	Political Process in India	The course will introduce the students to Indian party system, voting behavior, regionalism, and inter-play between caste, religion and politics. The course also familiarize the students about actual working of the modern Indian state and the contradictory dynamics of state power.
PLSHGE-2	Contemporary Political economy	The course introduces the students to the main approaches to the contemporary political economy and also to the capitalist transformation from feudalism to capitalism and ultimately to

		globalized world. The course also make awareness about the various issues in development and about development dilemmas.

PLSHCC-5	Introduction To Comparative Government and Politics	This course help the students to understand nature and scope of comparative politics and the historical context of the evolution and development of the discipline. It also introduce them to the theoretical perspectives of capitalism, socialism and colonialism. Apart from this, familiarizes the students about the comparative studies of constitutions and political economy of UK, Brazil, Nigeria and PRC
PLSHCC-6	Perspectives on Public Administration	This course on Public Administration helps the students to learn and comprehend the classical theories of public administration and contemporary developments in the discipline.
PLSHCC-7	Perspectives on International Relations and World History	This course aims at creating awareness and knowledge about the development of state system and important theories on international relations. It also provides students comprehensive overview of the major political events of world history covering First World War to post Cold war developments.
PLSHSE-1	Public Opinion and Survey Research	It is a basic course which will help students to understand public opinion and its importance in a democratic countries. It equip them to survey research methods and to develop knowledge about and utilization of qualitative data, sampling, methods of data collection and data analysis.
PLSHGE-3	Gandhi and the Contemporary World	The course imparts knowledge about Gandhi's alternative views on modernity, civilization, economic development and state and democracy. It also imparts knowledge about the concept of Satyagraha and Satyagraha in action in case of peasant protest, critique of caste, social harmony and communal unity. The course also familiarize students with legacy of Gandhi.

PLSHCC-8	Political processes and Institutions in Comparative Perspectives	Students learn about the approaches of comparative politics, concept of electoral systems, party systems, and nation state. It familiarizes students with the process of

		democratization in postcolonial, post-authoritarian and post-communist countries. The course also imparts knowledge about debate around territorial division of power with the historical context of Federation and confederation.
PLSHCC-9	Public Policy and Administration in India	The course provides knowledge to the students about the interface between public policy and administration in India. Students also will be acquainted with the issues like, decentralization, administrative accountability, citizens and administration and welfare administration in India.
PLSHCC-10	Global Politics	The course introduces students to the concepts and debates on globalizations. It also acquainted them with multiple dimensions of globalization along with main global economic anchor .It also offer insights into the main global issues like, terrorism, migration, nuclear proliferation, climate change debates and also global power shifts.
PLSHSE-2	Legislative Practices and Procedures	This course imparts knowledge to the students about power and functions of people's representatives of various levels, law making process, and budget making process, functions of Standing Committee and the role of mass media in law making.
PLSHGE-4	United Nations and Global Politics	The course introduces students to the origin, objectives, principles and structure and functions of key organs of UNO and also about its specialized agencies.

PLSHCC-11	Classical Political Philosophy	This course will acquainted learners with classical philosophical thought especially Greek political thought along with some modern Western thought. It also helps the students to understand the way of study the text and its interpretations.
PLSHCC-12	Indian Political Thought-I	By this paper students acquainted with the ancient Indian political thought from Bramhanic to Synchratic traditions including Ved Vyasa,Manu, Kautilya, Barani, Abul Fazal and

		Kabir. It helps them to understand Indian philosophy and statecraft.
PLSHDS-1	Indian Foreign Policy in Globalizing World	This paper will help students to gather knowledge about the evolution of Indian Foreign Policy and how India negotiates with some other power-full countries.
PLSHDS-2	United Nation and Global Conflicts	This course introduces students to the origin of UNO and its Objectives and Principles, functioning of key organizations and Specialized Agencies. It also acquainted them with UNO'S endeavor to ensure peace and security and with some important Global conflicts, such as, Korean confkict, Vietnam war, Afganisthan war, Bolkan crisis. An attempt also has been made to evaluate the success and failure of UNO and the need for its reformation.

PLSHCC- I3	Modern Political Philosophy	It will introduce students to the concept of modernity and its discourse. Students will be acquainted with the political thought of Rousseau, Wollstonecraft, J. S. Mill, Karl Marx and A. Kollantai which will enhance the greater perspective of knowledge about the modern political philosophy.
PLSHCC -14	Indian Political Thought-II	The course enables the students to gain knowledge about the modern Indian political thought. They learn some socio political ideas of Rammohan Roy, Vivekananda, Rabindranath Tagore, Gandhi, B.R. Ambedkar, V.D.Savarkar and Mohammad Iqbal. This course enable them to get insight to the political philosophy of the modern period and as well as the relationship between state individual and society.
PLSHDS-3	Citizenship in a Globalizing World	This course has been designed to familiarize the students to the various concepts of citizenship and its evolution from ancient Greek-Roman period to modern multicultural diversified state and society.

DSC1C	Comparative Government and Politics	This course enable students to know about the nature and scope of comparative political analysis and the functioning of different type of regimes. It also imparts knowledge about electoral system, party system and various debates on changing nature of nation state and its security in a globalizing world.
SEC-1	Legislative Support	This course provides knowledge regarding power and functions of MPs, MLAs and member of urban and local self- governing bodies. It also help the students to learn about law making process, parliamentary committee system, budget making process and role of mass media in law making process.

DSE-1A	Themes in Comparative Political Theory	It will introduce students to the distinctive features of Indian and Western political thought. They also learn and understand about the Indian political thinker like Koutilya, Tilak, Gandhi, Ambedkar, Lohia, Nehru, Joyprakash Narayana and Ramabai.
